

Hopeful Love By Fr. Carlos

Jesus heals all our wounds, especially the most difficult

ones. For all the disciples and especially Peter it was for sure a great joy to see Jesus risen and alive among them, but at the beginning Jesus's resurrection wasn't enough for them to heal their wounds and regrets about the fact of the passion and death of Jesus. The encounter of the risen Jesus and the disciples in the Sea of Galilee this Sunday gives us the inspiration to make Jesus's resurrection and forgiveness our own. Sometimes, we know that Jesus is risen and He is indeed alive, yet our hearts are still broken, like Peter in today's gospel. Likewise Peter we too need to allow Jesus to transform our fears, uncertainties and insecurities into a hopeful love. Hopeful love because if we do not believe that Jesus can forgive us, we cannot fully experience the resurrection. Just as Peter and the disciples were not fully aware of the meaning of the resurrection and the love of Jesus for them until that encounter at the sea of Galilee, we could not be aware of his love and resurrection in our own lives until we meet again with the risen Lord.

Peter's story is like that. He made great mistakes, but Jesus didn't throw him away. Instead, He restored him. Jesus' love gave Peter the courage to lead the early church. That same love upholds the Church today. It is a love that forgives, restores, and calls us to keep going—even in our later years. Jesus didn't just forgive Peter—He entrusted him with the care of others. This is the power of God's love. It doesn't merely cover our sins; it transforms our lives. Peter the denier became Peter the shepherd, the preacher at Pentecost, the rock upon which Christ began to build His Church.

Pope Francis spoke many times about the power of forgiveness. One story he shared deeply reflects the love Jesus showed to Peter after his denial and the love Christ still shows to His Church today.

When Jorge Mario Bergoglio was a young man, before he entered the seminary, he did much time doing volunteer work in his own city closely with the poor and the marginalized in Buenos Aires, Argentina. During one of his visits, he met an elderly woman who had been through deep personal pain. She had been abused by her own father when she was a child. The kind of wound she carried is hard to imagine. For years, she struggled with

bitterness and sorrow.

But something extraordinary happened.

She told the young Bergoglio, "I have forgiven my father. I pray for him every day. I even ask God to bring him to heaven."

Bergoglio was stunned. He asked her, "But how could you do that? After all he did to you?"

She replied, "Because Jesus has forgiven me so much. How could I not forgive, too?"

This woman's act of forgiveness left a deep mark on Pope Francis. He has referred to it often as one of the most powerful examples of Christian love he has ever witnessed. It reminded him—and all of us—that true forgiveness is not just something we receive from Jesus. It is something we are called to extend, even in the hardest circumstances.

Just as Jesus forgave Peter after he denied Him, just as He built His Church on a flawed man's faith and repentance, Jesus teaches us that forgiveness is the foundation of His kingdom. It heals broken hearts, restores lost dignity, and gives new life.

And this is also the heart of the Church—not an institution of perfect people, but a family held together by the love and forgiveness of Christ. Pope Francis often says, "The Church is a field hospital for the wounded." Like Peter, like the woman who forgave her father, and like so many of us who carry wounds, we find healing and hopeful love in the forgiving heart of the risen Jesus.
