FROM KAREN ROWE:

Hospitality

When Abraham was sitting in his tent and saw three visitors, he immediately went out to greet them. He did not just give them water and bread, but had a feast prepared for them. In the Old Testament, hospitality is a sacred duty with mutual obligations between host and guest—a covenantal relationship with serious social and spiritual significance. Refusal or mistreatment was considered a grave breach of honor. Abraham is a humble servant even though he did not realize the divinity of the three visitors. Abraham and Sarah were blessed with conceiving a child in their old age because of their genuine hospitality.

In the Gospel reading, Martha focuses on the task of hospitality, while Mary gives her full attention to the guest, Jesus. Mary's quiet devotion displayed greater reverence for Jesus compared to Martha's anxious toil. These two women represent the two dimensions of spiritual life. Martha honors Jesus through her works and Mary exemplifies the contemplative life. Both are essential for Christian life, but the latter is greater.

As Catholics, we are called to take these readings to heart, open our hearts and homes, give generously and worship in community, praising Our Lord, Jesus Christ and truly mean that all are welcome.

Hospitalidad

Cuando Abraham estaba sentado en su tienda y vio a tres visitantes, inmediatamente salió a recibirlos. No solo les dio agua y pan, sino que les preparó un banquete. En el Antiguo Testamento, la hospitalidad es un deber sagrado con obligaciones mutuas entre el anfitrión y el huésped, una relación de pacto con un gran significado social y espiritual. La negativa o el maltrato se consideraban una grave violación del honor. Abraham es un siervo humilde a pesar de que no se dio cuenta de la divinidad de los tres visitantes. Abraham y Sara fueron bendecidos con la concepción de un hijo en su vejez debido a su genuina hospitalidad.

En la lectura del Evangelio, Marta se centra en la tarea de la hospitalidad, mientras que María presta toda su atención al huésped, Jesús. La silenciosa devoción de María mostraba una mayor reverencia por Jesús en comparación con el ansioso trabajo de Marta. Estas dos mujeres representan las dos dimensiones de la vida espiritual. Marta honra a Jesús a través de sus obras y María ejemplifica la vida contemplativa. Ambos son esenciales para la vida cristiana, pero el último es mayor.

Como católicos, estamos llamados a tomar en serio estas lecturas, abrir nuestros corazones y hogares, dar generosamente y adorar en comunidad, alabando a Nuestro Señor, Jesucristo y realmente significar que todos son bienvenidos.
