Catholic Celebrations — November through December 12

As we journey through the final weeks of the liturgical year and enter the beautiful season of Advent, our parish is invited to walk together in prayer, gratitude, and joyful hope. The Church offers us rich celebrations from November into December that renew our faith and remind us of God's closeness.

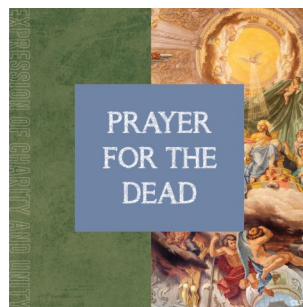
- ⇒ During November, we begin with **All Saints Day** and **All Souls Day**, remembering that we are part of a great spiritual family—those on earth, in heaven, and those being purified by God's mercy. As the month continues, we honor **Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe (Sunday November 23th)**, closing the liturgical year and preparing our hearts for the coming of Advent.
- ⇒ With **Advent, which begins the last day of November**, we enter a time of holy expectation and deeper reflection, awaiting the coming of Christ with hope. Advent invites families to slow down, pray more intentionally, and prepare spiritually for Christmas.
- ⇒ In this sacred season we also celebrate the **Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception on Monday, December 8**, honoring the special grace given to Mary to be conceived without sin. She is the Patroness of our nation and a powerful guide who leads us to her Son.
- ⇒ Our celebrations joyfully continue as we prepare for **December 12 at 8 PM, the feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe**, Mother of the Church and Star of the New Evangelization. She reminds us of God's closeness to all people—especially the humble, the poor, and those seeking renewal of faith. This year we have the honor to welcome Bishop John to celebrate this mass.
